→ Another initiative of ACCA21 is the Centre for Environmentally Sound Technology Transfer (CESTT) 环境无害化技术转移中心, www.cestt.org.cn (Chinese + English). CESTT was founded in 1997 with the support of the Ministry of Science and Technology of China, the Asian Development Bank, and the Environmental Resources Management China. CESTT's "mission is to promote the transfer and adoption of environmentally sound technology (EST) by forming bridges between policy makers, technology suppliers, technology developers, financial institutions, and Chinese industry, in particular small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs)."

→ Created in 1996, the CEEC is a technical support institution to SEPA (see above), responsible for environmental publicity, education and training. It also functions as the Department of Environmental Technology Exchange and Public Education of the China-Japan Friendship Environmental Protection Centre, in which it is housed. Its major tasks are the development of activities concerning national environmental protection publicity and education as well as the training of personnel in this regard. As part of the CEEC, our CESDRRC represents its reference and research section.

 - → Very informative environmental information website! It is a product of the Shanghai Environment Education Centre/ Green World 上海市环境保护宣传教育中心/ 绿色 世界, www.greenworld.net.cn (Chinese only, for English part see Shanghai Environment Online), which is the provincial department of CEEC (the CEEC being the central institution with nationwide responsibility).
- ◆ <u>www.greenschools.com.cn</u> China Green Schools 绿色学校网 so far in Chinese only
 - → The China Green Schools program run by the Environmental Education Department of CEEC helps schools use energy efficiently through building retrofits, changes in operational and maintenance routines, and changes in the behaviour of students, teachers, custodians, administrators, and community partners.

- ♦ <u>www.greenfood.org.cn</u>China Green Food Development Centre (CGFDC), Beijing/ China Green Food Net 中国绿色食品网 Chinese only
 - → "Green Food is safe and contamination-free food of high quality and full of nutrition", it says on the homepage of the CGFDC. The institution was established to organise and carry out the so-called "Green Food Project", i.e. developing a green food industry, throughout the country, and to clearly mark Green Food with labels.

4. NGOs within China

 - → EETPC is a project of the Television Trust for the Environment (TVE international), <u>http://info.tve.org/</u> (English only), which was founded in 1984 in Great Britain. TVE international wants to function as a "catalyst for the production and distribution of films about environmental, developmental, health and human rights issues". The aim is to increase general environmental awareness with the help of TV broadcasts as well as other audio-visual media.

 - → This website that contains collected information from officially published media reports in China is a product of the Institute of Environment and Development (IED) 环境与发展研究所 www.ied.ac.cn (Chinese + English), an NGO that was founded in Beijing in 1994, aiming at bringing about public awareness of environmental development issues as well as sustainable development through public education, information or knowledge dissemination and research.

- ◆ <u>www.fon.org.cn</u> Friends of Nature (FON) 自然之友 Chinese + English
 - → Founded by environmental activist Liang Congjie, FON was formally registered in 1994 as the Academy for Green Culture, an affiliate to the non-governmental Academy for Chinese Culture. It is a non-profit public welfare organization, funded by membership fees and public support.
- ◆ <u>www.gvbchina.org</u> Global Village of Beijing (GVB) 北京地球村环境文化中心 Chinese + English
 - → The NGO that is led by Sheri Xiaoyi Liao is one of the more well known Chinese NGOs outside of China. It organises environmental projects and activities and claims to have more than 4,000 volunteers nationwide.
- ◆ <u>www.cepf.org.cn</u> China Environmental Protection Foundation (CEPF) 中华环境保 护基金金 Chinese + English
 - → Founded in 1993, CEPF was the first non-governmental foundation dedicated to environmental protection in China. Several high-ranking officials are members of this organization, such as Prof. Qu Geping, President of the Natural Resources Conservation Committee of the China National People's Congress, who is the President of the CEPF's Board of Directors.
- ◆ <u>www.lead.org.cn</u> Leadership for Environment and Development (LEAD) China 国际环境与发展学院 mainly in English, some articles in Chinese
 - → LEAD is one of the 14 member programs being carried out by the Institute of Environment and Development, an environmental NGO in Beijing. There are apparently 100 Chinese LEAD fellows and associates, playing active roles in their respective positions "to advance the sustainability of the earth system".
- ♦ <u>www.snisd.org.cn</u> South-North Institute for Sustainable Development (SNISD) 北 京天恒可持续发展研究所 Chinese + English
 - → SNISD is a Chinese non-profit environmental organization based in Beijing that is doing publicity work, training, consulting and exchanges. It states its mission as carrying out research for laws, regulations and policies concerning environmental protection and sustainable development, and promoting the use of renewable energy, especially in the Asia-Pacific region.
- ◆ <u>www.gitcp.com</u> Green Industry and Technology Promotion Centre (GITPC), Shanghai 上海市绿色工业促进会 Chinese + English
 - → GITPC is an NGO, which regards the promotion of green technologies, products, marketing and propaganda of green concepts as its duty. Members are scientific research institutes, universities and colleges, major industrial holdings/ groups as well as companies/ enterprises in Shanghai.

5. Hong Kong Based Organisations

 - → The committee was set up in 1990 to promote public awareness of environmental issues and encourage the public to contribute actively to a better environment. It is composed of members from green groups, the educational sector, academic fields, industrial and business organisations, professional institutions, community service agencies, and representatives of relevant government departments, including the environmental protection department. The committee plans and organises many environmental events and activities for different sectors of the community. A highly entertaining, informative and nicely made up website with opportunities for interaction and communication!

◆ <u>www.greenpower.org.hk</u> Green Power 绿色力量 Chinese + English

→ This NGO aims at promoting a green lifestyle and arouse public concern on local environmental issues. Projects include the Chinese White Dolphin Centre (developing environmental conservation), and the Green Field Ecological Education Centre (facilitate interflow of green education between Hong Kong and the Chinese mainland and arouse awareness towards Sustainable Development in China, cooperation with the Guangzhou Environmental Protection Bureau and Guangzhou Research Institute of Environmental Protection).

◆ <u>www.greenpeace-china.org.hk</u> Greenpeace-China 绿色和平 Chinese + English

→ Officially registered in Hong Kong in 1997 as a local NGO, Greenpeace-China has been successful in developing into an active player that is able to act financially independent from the international organization by covering its costs from donations. The NGO is also active on the Chinese mainland.

◆ <u>www.cleanhongkong.gov.hk</u> Clean Hong Kong 清洁香港 Chinese + English

→ Clean Hong Kong is a campaign against littering and dumping of waste in order to bring about overall improvement of the city environment. It was officially launched in 2000 by the Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, Mr. Tung Chee Hwa, and combines active cleansing operations with public education and publicity efforts.

6. NGOs outside of China

→ This NGO consists of voluntarily cooperating and communicating experts from different fields of environmental protection. PACE was formed in 1996 in Washington, D.C. as a response to the realization that China's environmental condition is decisively influencing global environmental conditions, so by improving the situation in China, one could simultaneously make significant global improvements. The website's focus is on discussion and information exchange between members. PACE moreover used to publish an excellent online magazine called 'SINOSPHERE', which has not been published during the last year, though (we are waiting for its revival).

- → The project's 'Working Group on Environment in U.S.-China Relations' launches programmes and publications to encourage dialogue among U.S. and Chinese scholars, policy makers and NGOs on environmental and energy challenges in China. In this quest, it regularly brings together experts with diverse backgrounds and affiliations.
- → Especially note the working group's regular publication called 'China Environment Series', which has an excellent collection of in-depth articles!

- → REACH is an independent E-journal based in the USA, which strives to be neutral as well as "factual, scientific, objective and entertaining". Its goal is to provide a forum for information sharing and open discussion, and thereby to promote a more scientific decision-making process and a better understanding of natural resources and the environment.

 - → GEA China is a joint initiative between the Chinese Ministry of Science and Technology (MOST) and Global Communications for Conservation (GCC), a US-based NGO. It works with Chinese educators to promote literacy and assists with the training of government officials to integrate environmental concerns into the decision-making process.

 - → China Development Brief is an independent publication established in 1996 to report on aid to China, highlighting the work of international and Chinese NGOs.

 - → In 1996, the German Ministry of Economics and Technology launched the Environmental Area Manager Project, in order to help German environmental technologies to get a footing in the Chinese market. Environmental Area Managers are part of the AHK organization, and in their position as experts of the respective environmental markets function as mediators between German suppliers and Chinese customers. They provide all kinds of services, mainly for German industries, ranging from individual market analyses to the monthly newsletter ECOFlash.
 - → A bridgehead for the connection to the supply side in Germany is the Centre for the International Transfer of Environmental Technologies (ITUT) 德国国际环保技术转让中心 www.itut.de (German, English and Chinese), with an extensive data collection of small and medium sized environmental technology providers under www.enviromeister.de.
- ◆ Centre for Environmentally Sound Technology Transfer (CESTT) 环境无害化技 术转移中心, <u>www.cestt.org.cn</u> (Chinese + English) see ACCA21 (Government Institutions)
 - www.riet.org Regional Institute of Environmental Technology (RIET) English only
 → RIET came to life in 1993 as a result of a mutual project of the European Commission and the government of Singapore. It has been an officially registered NGO in Singapore since 1998, which defines itself as forum for networking on environmental business issues, environmental intelligence provider, counsel for business partnerships, advisor in eco-efficiency and link to Asian environment projects.

 - → China Environment is specially set up as an information and business information exchange centre with the mission to provide its members with value-added services, e.g. business opportunities, new products, headhunting, information provision/ search, a forum, etc.

 → ERM is a privately operated and managed joint venture corporation, with offices in Shanghai, Beijing and Guangzhou, providing environmentally health and safety consulting services in China. Its expertise is based on a partnership with the Chinese Research Academy of Environmental Sciences (CRAES), the major technical and policy think tank of SEPA.

- → A monthly environmental newspaper from Inner Mongolia. Most of the paper's lively reports about the environmental situation in Inner Mongolia are written by 13 to 17 year old middle school students. This year, Little Horse was awarded the Chinese Environmental Journalist Association's Earth Prize.
